Grading Requirements for Shodan (19/09/2011)

(Judo Victoria Rank Accreditation Board)

Note: This document refers to the JFA Grading Syllabus (in particular, contest points, time in grade points and service points) which may be downloaded from the Judo Victoria website.

Note: Members of the Rank Accreditation Board and Referees Commission can be found on the Judo Victoria website. Contact should be through the Chairmen.

A DVD is available for purchase which will assist the applicant in the demonstration of the Go Kyo No Waza, Renraku Waza and Kaeshi Waza requirements. (Contact Malcolm Slade 9576 4066)

Shodan grading requirements are separated into two streams:

1. JVI members applying through contest points, knowledge and time.

- 1.1 Nage No Kata as required.
Examined by the JVI Kata Commission.
The Kata must be demonstrated at a kata seminar or JVI event.
- 1.2 Knowledge requirements.
Must be able to demonstrate two techniques from each of Te Waza, Koshi Waza, Ashi Waza, Ma Sutemi Waza, Yoko Sutemi Waza, Renraku Waza and Kaeshi Waza, as selected by the examiner.
- 1.3 Time as an Ik Kyu , 1 year with 150 contest points obtained, 2 years with 100 contest points obtained.

2. JVI members applying through knowledge, service to JVI and time.

It is expected that members applying through knowledge, service to JVI and time in grade will become part of a club's instructing group. Judo knowledge and experience are necessary requirements and so form the basis of the grading requirements.

Four components of the grading are required, namely Knowledge, Refereeing, Nage No Kata and time as an Ik Kyu.

2.1 Knowledge - Demonstration of Tachi Waza and Ne Waza.

Examined by the JVI Rank Accreditation Board

Knowledge Requirements

- 2.1.1 Go Kyo No Waza
Must be able to demonstrate up to 15 out of the 40 throws in the Go Kyo No Waza, as selected by the examiner.
Techniques may be requested in both left and right directions.
- 2.1.2 Renraku Waza
Up to 5 techniques
- 2.1.3 Kaeshi Waza
Up to 5 techniques
- 2.1.4 Ne Waza
Techniques from the following - No more than 5 in each category will be required.

- * Turn overs
- * Escape from Osae Waza
- * Defence against Shime Waza
- * Defence against Kansetsu Waza
- * Combinations of Osae Waza into Kansetsu Waza

2.2 Obtain a JVI State C Referee's licence.

Examined by the JVI Referees Commission.

The requirements to obtain a State C Referee's Licence may be obtained through the Chairman of the Referees Commission.

2.3 Demonstrate Nage No Kata

Examined by the JVI Kata Commission.

The Kata requirements may be obtained through the Chairman of the Kata Commission.

The Kata must be demonstrated at a Kata seminar or JVI event.

2.4 Time

Three years as an Ik Kyu with 150 service points, five years without.
